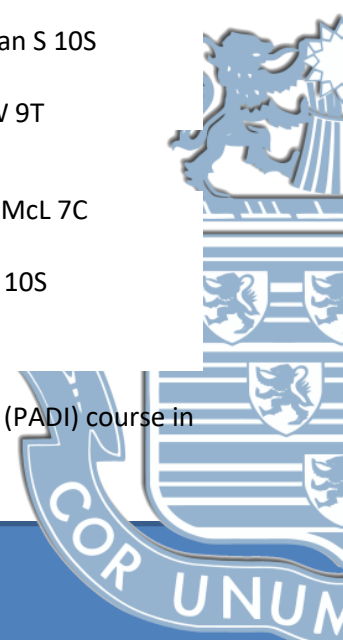

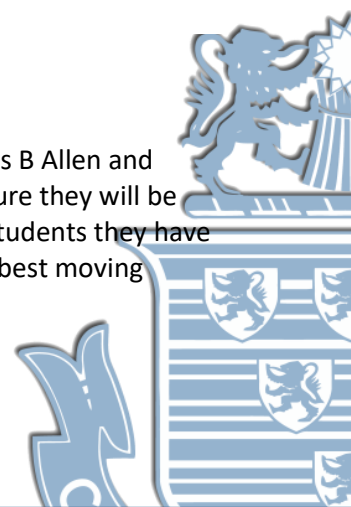
Your voice has the power to shape the future of crime, policing and community safety in Lincolnshire.
